The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for a Detective Investigator position located in the Major Investigations Unit (NYC), within the Investigations Division. Candidates should be hard-working, self-motivated, and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Under the direct supervision of the Detective Supervisor of the Major Investigations Unit, the Detective Investigators work collaboratively in case-specific investigative teams with Assistant Attorneys General, analysts, and forensic auditors to conduct highly complex criminal and civil investigations, using the highest level of professionalism, judgment, and discretion.

Successful candidates will combine traditional investigative experience and skills with strong communication and interpersonal skills and the ability to work effectively in multi-disciplinary teams.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must have at least ten (10) years of prior law enforcement experience.
- Have a current NYS basic police academy certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete all requirements to obtain NYS basic police academy certification.
- Trained and certified in dignitary protection.
- Experience coordinating with local, state and federal agencies to secure protection of dignitaries.
- Expert interviewing and interrogation skills.
- Extensive experience in the investigation of all types of criminal activity with emphasis on white-collar crime, fraud and identity theft.
- Experience investigating confidential and sensitive matters, such as those dealing with cooperating witnesses and undercover operations.
- Experience conducting surveillance, effecting arrests and executing search warrants.
- Excellent writing and interpersonal skills.
- Experience testifying as a witness.
- Extensive proficiency with computers and the ability to utilize the internet and social media as investigative tool.
- Having established law enforcement contacts on the local, state and federal levels within the law enforcement community in the New York City area.
- Must possess a valid NYS Driver's License with ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

The annual salary for this position is \$77,608. Appointments in New York City receive an additional \$4,000 location pay. This position is overtime eligible. Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.
