# **Application Deadline is November 9, 2025**

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Assistant Chief-Executive Officer for the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) within the Investigations Division. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated, and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

MFCU, the centerpiece of New York's efforts to combat Medicaid provider fraud, conducts complex investigations into fraud committed by Medicaid providers and others in the healthcare industry who steal from New York State, those involved in the diversion of prescription narcotics, and to investigate and prosecute abuse and neglect of residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other residential healthcare facilities. Detective Investigators work collaboratively in case specific teams with Assistant Attorneys General, analysts, and forensic auditors to learn how to conduct highly complex criminal and civil investigations, using the highest level of professionalism, judgement, and discretion.

# The Assistant Chief is the Executive Officer of the MFCU. The duties and responsibilities of the MFCU Assistant Chief include, but are not limited to:

- Act as the Commanding Officer in the absence of the Deputy Chief/CO.
- Monitor/Coordinate the MFCU's investigations, budget needs, and work closely with the MFCU Chief Administrative officer on unit expenditures.
- Assist with the units personnel hiring, development and promotion recommendations.
- Supervise MFCU Detective Supervisors statewide.
- Oversee the Units yearly performance evaluations statewide.
- Create/provide innovative ideas, strategies, training, and equipment evaluations to the MFCU Commanding
  Officer.
- Prepare and present briefings for senior agency management in conjunction with or in the absence of the Commanding Officer.
- Liaise with the Federal HHS-OIG in conjunction with or in the absence of the Commanding Officer.
- Review all operations/tact plans statewide.

### **Minimum Qualifications:**

- Must have at least ten years of law enforcement experience and current NYS basic police school certification.
- At least 5 years of Police supervisory level experience at the management level or higher managing detectives.
- Extensive management experience in managing staff of various ranks.
- Excellent interpersonal communication skills.
- Extensive contacts in the law enforcement and social service community throughout New York State.
- Knowledge of/experience with NYS Contract Award and Vendor guidelines.
- Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

## **Preferred Qualifications:**

- Graduate of FBI National Academy, Southern Police Institute, or similar police leadership program.
- Bachelors degree or higher from an accredited college or university.

• Extensive experience with the EJustice System, Accurint, Clear, EMedny, and Microsoft Office Suite programs.

**The annual salary for this position is \$140,334.** Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.
