# **Application Deadline is December 12, 2025**

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for a Detective Supervisor position in the Office of Special Investigations in New York City. Candidates should be hard working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

In June 2020, the New York State Legislature passed legislation codifying and expanding the Governor's previous **Executive Order** granting the OAG the jurisdiction to investigate and potentially prosecute incidents when a police officer or peace officer causes the death of a person.

Detective Supervisors oversee investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion to ensure the integrity, thoroughness, and fairness of investigations.

#### <u>Duties performed by Detective Supervisors may include, but are not limited to, the following:</u>

- Work collaboratively with Assistant Attorney General (AAG) to plan, direct and supervise highly complex and sensitive investigations, using the highest level of professionalism, judgement, and discretion.
- Provide the first level of review on administrative matters, such as time sheets, expense reports, state vehicle
  usage and maintenance, and overtime approval for Unit members, as well as, evaluating the annual performance
  of investigators assigned to the Unit, fairly, consistently, and accurately.
- Work closely with local, state and federal law enforcement agencies.

### **Minimum Qualifications:**

- The ability to recognize the need for a unique and special mindset to be a part of OSI, which includes the ability to be independent, objective, and free from outside influences, where specific outcomes may be sought for any given OSI case(s).
- Cultural competence to understand and effectively respond to cultural differences that may impact an investigation.
- Must have at least ten (10) years of law enforcement with at least five (5) years of law enforcement investigative experience.
- Have a current NYS basic police academy certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete
  all requirements to obtain NYS basic police academy certification.
- Experience working with other law enforcement agencies; and having established law enforcement contacts on the local, state, and federal levels.
- Experience in effectively planning, conducting, and managing multiple long-term, complex investigations in multidisciplinary teams.
- Excellent interpersonal communications, analytical, and writing skills.
- Extensive experience with interviewing and interrogation.
- Must possess strong leadership skills and a proven record of utilizing good judgement.
- Experience with responding to and overseeing field operations such as homicide scenes, deaths at correctional facilities, motor vehicle related deaths, and search and arrest warrant applications and executions.
- Experience testifying in court and must have extensive experience in the investigation of confidential and sensitive matters.
- Extensive experience in investigating, managing, and supervising homicides, police-involved shootings, motor vehicle collisions, deaths in custody, and/or cases involving alleged law enforcement misconduct.

- Proficiency with computers, common word processing applications, search engines, investigative and law enforcement databases, and internet research.
- Proficiency in writing and reviewing case reports.
- Must demonstrate leadership through communication, motivation, and positivity to ensure projects, initiatives, and other work functions are performed successfully.
- Must possess a valid NYS Driver's License with ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

### **Preferred Qualifications:**

- Prior supervisory experience, specifically in law enforcement.
- Prior or current Field Training Officer experience.
- Prior death investigation experience.
- The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language, in addition to English (e.g. Spanish, Mandarin, Russian, Korean, etc.).
- Bachelor's degree in a related field.
- 5 years' experience as an OAG sworn law enforcement detective.

The annual salary for this position is \$108,478. Appointments in New York City receive an additional \$4,000 location pay. Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.

Candidates from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
