Dear Chief Cecile,

The Office of the New York State Attorney General has reviewed your agency's Executive Law § 75(5)(b) referral of complaints from June 2021 to June 2024 involving Police Officer Joseph Murray. Based on our review, we have not made a finding of a pattern or practice of misconduct, use of excessive force, or acts of dishonesty by Officer Murray.

However, in SPD OOPS # 22-057 (DR 22-372112), Officer Murray assisted in handcuffing an eight-year-old-child who was initially suspected of involvement in a robbery. Whether the handcuffing of the minor was within or without SPD Policy 302.3.3, handcuffing children should be a last resort, and in this case, the eight-year-old did not appear dangerous, resistive or evasive and could have been sat in a patrol vehicle while the incident was investigated, as were others involved in this incident.
