The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for a Deputy Chief Investigator position in the Office of Special Investigations' (OSI) Albany location. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated, and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

In June 2020, the New York State Legislature passed legislation codifying and expanding the Governor's previous [Executive Order](#) granting the OAG the jurisdiction to investigate and potentially prosecute incidents when a police officer or peace officer causes the death of a person.

OSI participates in investigations of the circumstances, facts, and conditions connected with incidents covered by the OSI's legislative mandate, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion to ensure the integrity, thoroughness, and fairness of the investigations.

**Minimum Qualifications:**

- Must have at least ten (10) years of law enforcement supervisory experience, preferably holding the police rank of Sergeant (or equivalent) or higher.
- Must also have current NYS basic police academy certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete all requirements to obtain NYS basic police academy certification.
- Must have extensive experience in the investigation of confidential and sensitive matters.
- Must have advanced expertise in investigating, managing and supervising homicides, police-involved shootings, motor vehicle collisions, deaths in custody and/or cases involving alleged law enforcement misconduct.
- Awareness of pending or proposed legislation related to OCI related work (e.g., use of force, less than lethal alternatives, etc.).
- Experience and skill in making recommendations for changes in policing policy.
- Must possess a valid NYS driver license with ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- The NYS Public Officers Law requires that all police officers be citizens of the United States of America and reside within the State of New York at the time of appointment.

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- Expert interviewing and interrogation skills.
- Experience effectively conducting and managing multiple investigations.
- Experience interacting, coordinating, and working with other law enforcement agencies.
- Have established law enforcement contacts throughout the State of New York.
- Excellent interpersonal communication and strong writing skills.
- Advanced proficiency with computers, common word processing applications, use of search engines, investigative databases and internet research.
- Commitment to a collaborative team environment and to nurturing an integrated, inclusive, and diverse culture.
- The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language in addition to English (e.g., Spanish, Mandarin, Russian, Korean, etc.).
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution.

**The annual salary for this position is \$147,986.** Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.
