The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for a Detective Supervisor position in White Plains. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated, and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

The role of the OCTF is to conduct complex, long-term investigations into various types of organized criminal activity. The majority of the Unit's investigations utilize advanced and specialized investigative techniques such as physical surveillance, court authorized eavesdropping of telephones, businesses, vehicles, and computers, as well as search warrants, which include the use of still and video photography. The nature of the investigations conducted by OCTF includes traditional organized crime - gambling, loan sharking, extortion, and narcotics, among others.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must have at least ten (10) years of prior law enforcement experience.
- Have a current NYS basic police academy certification or NYS specialized police investigator certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete all requirements to obtain such certification.
- Excellent interpersonal communication skills.
- Experience holding the rank of Sergeant, Detective 2nd Grade, or the equivalent.
- Extensive experience conducting physical surveillance and electronic eavesdropping and being an affiant on search warrants.
- Extensive experience in loan sharking and gambling investigations and recognition by the courts as a "gambling expert".
- Knowledgeable of SYTECH.
- Experience debriefing and developing confidential informants.
- At least five years of experience working as a member of a joint task force with OCTF.
- Management experience.
- Experience training police officers in the investigation of traditional organized crime.
- Having established contacts within the law enforcement community serving the greater NYC area.
- Must possess a valid NYS Driver's License with ability to operate a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

The annual salary for this position is \$108,478. Appointments in White Plains receive an additional \$4,000 location pay.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.
