The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Deputy Chief Investigator in New York City. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

MFCU, the centerpiece of New York's efforts to combat Medicaid provider fraud, conducts complex investigations into fraud committed by Medicaid providers and others in the healthcare industry who steal from New York State, those involved in the diversion of prescription narcotics, and investigates and prosecutes abuse and neglect of residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other residential healthcare facilities. In prosecuting these cases the selected candidate will collaborate closely with the Deputy Attorney General, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Must have at least ten years of law enforcement experience.
- Must have supervisory investigative experience, holding the rank of Detective Supervisor or above.
- Must have a current NYS basic police academy certification or NYS specialized police investigator certification approved by DCJS or the ability to successfully complete all requirements to obtain such certification.
- Experience utilizing electronic case management systems for case management/review.
- Experience querying databases to gather information related to suspected financial crimes.
- Experience conducting stationary and moving surveillance.
- Experience supervising internal and criminal investigations.
- Proficient in financial and money laundering investigations.
- Having established contacts within the law enforcement community throughout the State of New York.
- Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in a related field.

The annual salary for this position is \$154,645. Appointments in New York City receive an additional \$4,000 location pay. Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7 availability. This position is in the exempt class, and incumbents serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General.
