

Assistant Chief: Investigations Division, Special Operations Unit - Statewide

The New York State Office of the Attorney General, Investigations Division, is seeking an experienced Assistant Chief Investigator to join its Special Operations Unit (SOU). The Investigations Division's Special Operations Unit provides investigative technical expertise and support to all Divisions, Bureaus and Units within the Office of the Attorney General. This is a Statewide Unit with 24 x 7 x 365 responsibilities. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people New York State.

The qualifications for this position are: At least five (5) years of law enforcement experience, and at least five (5) years of supervisory experience. Must have extensive experience in the planning and execution of technical surveillance operations and execution of eavesdropping warrants; extensive experience and expertise in the operation, management and administration of enterprise video surveillance systems, digital audio and video collection systems, wiretapping systems; knowledge and understanding of telecommunications network, underlying technologies, landline and mobile telephony; and extensive experience with enterprise network management, Microsoft based technologies, Cisco networking, managing storage area networks or SAN.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have current NYS basic police school certification.

Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.

The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends and requires 24/7/365 availability.

Cultural competence to understand and effectively respond to cultural differences for the purpose of involvement in undercover operations and/or otherwise to be inserted into investigations and interactions with targets across cultures.

Preferred qualifications, skills and education:

Experience testifying in Grand Jury and Court proceedings; experience and training in Technical Security Countermeasures technologies and operations; experience in planning and conducting covert undercover technical operations; knowledge and understanding of all State and Federal laws pertaining to technical, electronic, audio, and video surveillance, eavesdropping and wiretapping; excellent interpersonal communication and strong writing skills; commitment to a collaborative team environment and to nurturing an integrated, inclusive and diverse culture. The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language in addition to English (e.g. Spanish, Mandarin, Russian, Korean, etc.) preferred.
