



## **EMPLOYMENT ANNOUNCEMENT**

### **DETECTIVE INVESTIGATOR TRAINEE**

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Detective Investigator Trainee positions in various locations throughout the State. Candidates should be hard working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Detective Investigator Trainees work collaboratively in case specific teams with Detective Investigators, Assistant Attorney General, analysts and forensic auditors to learn how to conduct highly complex criminal and civil investigations, using the highest level of professionalism, judgement and discretion.

The Investigations Division is comprised of multiple units, any one of which you may be assigned to depending on the needs of the Division and Agency, including: Criminal Enforcement and Financial Crimes Unit, Organized Crime Task Force, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, Auto Insurance Fraud Unit, Public Integrity Unit, Executive Protection Unit, Special Operations Unit, Special Investigations and Prosecutions Unit, Sexual Offender Monitoring Unit and General Investigations Unit.

#### **Minimum qualifications:**

High school diploma, or equivalency, and either a two (2) year or four (4) year college degree or other qualifying law enforcement curriculum.

Must possess a valid NYS Driver's License with the ability to operate a motor vehicle.

Must have the ability to successfully complete all requirements to obtain NYS basic police academy certification.

The NYS Public Officer's Law requires that all police officers be citizens of the United States of America and reside within the State of New York at the time of appointment.

Candidates should possess strong writing, analytical and organizational skills. Candidates will be required to combine traditional investigative skills with strong interpersonal skills and the ability to work as part of an investigative team.

#### **Preferred qualifications, skills and education:**

Cultural competence to understand and effectively respond to cultural differences for the purpose of involvement in undercover operations and/or otherwise to be inserted into investigations and interactions with targets across cultures.

Strong communications, interpersonal and teamwork skills.

Proficiency with computers, common word processing applications, use of search engines and internet research.

The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language in addition to English.

Performance of duties may require unscheduled work on evenings and weekends. Selected candidates may be reassigned to other units within the Division, including the Special Investigations and Prosecutions Unit, based on the needs of the Investigations Division.
