

Detective Supervisor: Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU), NYC and Pearl River

The Office of the Attorney General, Investigations Division is seeking qualified candidates for promotion to Detective Supervisor. Current openings exist in the MFCU New York City and Pearl River Offices. Candidates should be of high moral character, hardworking, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

The Office of the Attorney General's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit is the center piece of New York's efforts to combat Medicaid provider fraud, conducting complex investigations into fraud committed by Medicaid providers and others in the healthcare industry. MFCU also investigates and prosecutes those involved in the diversion of prescription narcotics, and those who abuse and neglect residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other residential healthcare facilities.

The qualifications for this position include: Must have at least five (5) years of OAG investigative experience or at least ten (10) years of law enforcement with at least five (5) years of law enforcement investigative experience. Must possess and demonstrate excellent interpersonal communication, analytical and writing skills. Must possess strong leadership skills and a proven record utilizing good judgement. Must demonstrate proficiency with computers, common word processing applications, use of search engines, investigative and law enforcement databases and internet research. Must demonstrate proficiency in the use of ACISS, writing and reviewing case reports. Must have established regional state, local and federal law enforcement contacts. Experience in effectively planning, conducting and managing multiple, long-term, complex investigations in multidisciplinary teams.

Preferred qualifications:

Prior supervisory experience, specifically in law enforcement; experience planning and supervising field operations, such as surveillance operations and search warrant and arrest warrant operations. Familiarity conducting sensitive, internal investigations. Ability to work with and effectively coordinate with other law enforcement agencies. Bachelor's degree in a related field. Cultural competence to understand and effectively respond to cultural differences for the purpose of involvement in undercover operations and/or otherwise to be inserted into investigations and interactions with targets across cultures. The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language in addition to English (e.g., Spanish, Mandarin, Russian, Korean, etc.) is preferred.

Must have current NYS basic police school certification.

Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.
