

Detective Supervisor: Investigations Division, Special Operations Unit – Statewide

The New York State Office of the Attorney General (“OAG”), Investigations Division is seeking an experienced candidate for appointment to Detective Supervisor for its Special Operations Unit. The Investigations Division’s Special Operations Unit provides operational investigative technical expertise and support to all Divisions, Bureaus and Units within the Office of the Attorney General. This is a Statewide Unit with 24x7x365 responsibilities. Candidates should be of high moral character, hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

The qualifications for this position are: Must have at least five years of OAG investigative experience, or at least ten years of law enforcement with at least five years of law enforcement investigative experience. Must have experience in the planning and conducting of covert undercover technical operations; must have experience and be able to demonstrate locking system bypass techniques and skills; must have extensive experience in the configuration, setup and installation of wiretapping equipment/systems such as SyTech’s ADACS; training and experience in working in high voltage environments. Must have understanding and working knowledge of all Federal and State laws that pertain to technical, electronic, audio, video surveillance, eavesdropping and wiretapping.

Preferred qualifications, skills and education: Experience testifying before Grand Jury and Court proceedings; experience and training in Technical Security Countermeasures technologies and operations; experience in planning and conducting covert undercover technical operations; knowledge and understanding of all State and Federal laws pertaining to technical, electronic, audio, video surveillance, eavesdropping and wiretapping.

Cultural competence to understand and effectively respond to cultural differences for the purpose of involvement in undercover operations and/or otherwise to be inserted into investigations and interactions with targets across cultures. The ability to read, write, speak and understand a second language in addition to English is preferred.

Must have current NYS basic police academy certification approved by DCJS.

Must possess a valid NYS Driver’s License with the ability to operate a motor vehicle.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends as well as unscheduled travel within the State and requires 24/7/365 availability.
