Dear Commissioner Gramaglia,

This letter is notification that the Office of the Attorney General ("OAG") is closing our review of the Executive Law § 75(5)(b) referral of complaints involving Police Officer Kevin Murphy, based on his termination from the Buffalo Police Department pursuant to the Opinion and Award of Arbitrator Jeffrey M. Selnick dated October 11, 2023. Mr. Selnick's conclusions are consistent with our review of Complaint 2020-051.

While we have closed this referral based on Officer Murphy's termination, we note that in addition to Complaint 2020-051, there are three other instances of apparent misconduct in the complaints referred to the OAG. Complaint 2020-017 involved the use of force by Officer Murphy against a minor (specifically a head strike) while executing an arrest and, although the relevant interaction is not captured on BWC, the complainant's documented injuries support his account. With respect to Complaint 2020-039, BWC footage depicts an apparent *Payton* violation because Officer Murphy used a knife to open the door of the complainant's home and entered the home without a warrant. Complaint 2020-008 involved the apparently wrongful frisk, handcuffing, and detention of the passengers during a traffic stop, including the pregnant passenger, without the required level of reasonable suspicion.
