Antitrust Bureau - Chief Economist

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) seeks a Chief Economist to join its Antitrust Bureau in New York City. The Bureau enforces federal and state antitrust law on behalf of New York and its citizens, and is engaged in the full range of antitrust issues: horizontal and vertical restraints, monopolization and mergers. The OAG focuses on conduct that has caused, or has the potential to cause, significant harm to New Yorkers, and in some cases, nationally.

The Chief Economist employs economic theory and empirical modeling to analyze antitrust questions and make policy recommendations; and works with Bureau attorneys from the inception of an investigation to develop strategy that is consistent with sound economic analysis. In appropriate cases, the Chief Economist liaises with outside economic or industry experts.

As part of OAG, the Chief Economist works on non-antitrust matters as well.

The ideal candidate has:

- a Ph.D. or equivalent training in economics or finance;
- strong empirical and communications skills; and
- experience with real-world questions.
